There will also be times to remember the events which took place 100 years ago when the world was changed forever at the start of the First World War.

Estelle our editor has been extremely busy researching the fate of young Winterton men who went to war and sadly never came back. Some 13 of them have never been listed on the war memorial. It certainly is time to right a wrong and Winterton Town Council is now studying evidence on their individual cases.

Our 'n About will publish over time as much information as possible about the "forgotten 13". We start in this issue with Private Harold Mumby from the Lincolnshire Regiment (see page 3).

The Out 'n About readership has expanded and now covers neighbouring Roxby. As can be seen on page 4, Charlie Webster is also researching some "forgotten" young soldiers and would be most grateful if anyone can provide him with information, no matter how little. We understand that a commemorative event will be held at St Mary's Church, Roxby later this year.

Our editor has also assisted Burton upon Stather Heritage Group in tracking a "forgotten 16 year old boy" who was killed at the Battle of Jutland.

It would appear that Burton has never had a war memorial but this is going to be rectified in the near future with some 30 names for WW1 finally recognised on a new war memorial.

Our editor, during her research, also found comprehensive details regarding one of the previously unidentified names on the Appleby war memorial and has given this information to the Appleby website webmaster who in turn has promptly updated the war memorial section of their website.

100 years have gone but it is inspirational to see that new generations do not intend to forget the past and seek to show recognition for the people who lost their life. We should also give a thought to the ones who came back and who were not able to lead a normal life through physical and/or psychological scars. 2014 is the year to remember all this.

New name to be added to Winterton War Memorial

This year sees the centenary of Britain's entry into World War 1. Since last summer our editor, Estelle, has been busy researching the names listed on the Winterton War Memorial and using her 14 years of family history knowledge and experience, has helped to fill in quite a few of the gaps in the church booklet, although help is still needed in identifying one WW2 name - S Hall.

During the course of her research, more names of WW1 soldiers who were either born, brought up or lived in Winterton were found. Sadly they never returned and for some unknown reason are not listed on the town's war memorial.

Winterton Town Council owns the war memorial and at the April Town Council meeting, after almost 94 years since the memorial was unveiled, councillors looked at the submitted evidence and unanimously agreed to add the name of 241203 Private Harold Mumby of the Lincolnshire Regiment. Harold is not related to the editor, and this is his story...

Harold, the son of Frank and Hannah Sophia Mumby, was born on 17th March 1898 in Churchside, Winterton.

The 1901 census showed the family were living in a cottage in High Risby and by 1911 the family had moved to Idle Stop, Westwoodside, in the Isle of Axholme.

Harold's service record has survived and states that he enlisted in Haxey on 20th June 1915 and joined the 5th Battalion Lincolnshire Regiment. His parent's address at the time was listed as Idle Stop, Westwoodside, but they later moved to Misson Springs, Bawtry.

Harold was aged 17 when he enlisted and couldn't be sent overseas until aged 19 due to army

regulations. He disembarked in Le Havre in northern France on 24th February 1917 and less than a month later was wounded in the right foot and sent to hospital in Rouen. He later returned to England.

His medical records show that he was in hospital in Aberdeen

until April 1917 and returned to France in June. Harold was back in hospital again in Eastbourne from November 1917 to January 1918, and returned to France on 31st March 1918.



He was transferred to the 1st Battalion (C Company) on 4th April and received a gunshot wound on 19th April. Harold rejoined the 1st Battalion (C Company) and was killed in action on 25th August 1918. By then, his parents were living at 'The Hut', Austerfield, Bawtry.

Harold Mumby is buried in Adanac Military Cemetery, Miraumont in northern France.

High Risby comes under Roxby parish and Harold's name is not listed on the Roxby war memorial. A further search revealed that Harold is not listed on the war memorials for Haxey and Westwoodside, or Bawtry.

■ Estelle has now submitted a further 12 cases for councillors to consider the addition of names. If any of our readers have any information on names possibly missing from the war memorial who have links with Winterton, please do not hesitate to contact Out 'n About. This also includes those who may have served in Palestine, World War 2, Korea and later conflicts. Any information given will be thoroughly researched. Post-WW1 service records are still held by the Ministry of Defence and are accessible to family members only.

Commemorating those who served and returned

Estelle has also put forward a suggestion to Winterton Town Council. The town has a war memorial to commemorate those who served and did not return from the two world wars, but there is nothing in the town saying 'thank you' to those who came back.

Many returned from WW1 not only with physical and psychological scars, but also to no job, and no home, and that's why it's important to recognise their contribution as well.

A list of those who survived WW1 is currently being compiled by the editor and Winterton Town Council have agreed to pursue this idea.



Roxby war memorial

The war memorial in Roxby is the church clock which was renovated last year. It was installed in 1921 in memory of those from Roxby who fought in WW1 and also commemorates those who gave their lives.



Parish councillor, Charlie Webster, is researching the background of those who are named on the war memorial and he is particularly keen to identify if there are others who have been missed.

Names on the memorial are:

WW1 - Harold Burton, Arthur Collingwood, Sydney Markham, Tom Rowell, Albert Barley, Osborne Barnes, George Cartledge, Arthur Markham, Ernest and Arthur Gravell.

WW2 - Fred Barnes.

Since starting his research, Charlie has been made aware of six other men who were born in Roxby, but were living in other villages when they enlisted during WW1: John Boon, Harry John Birkett, John Martin, Harry Lancelot Mason, Harry Smith and Edwin Welton.

On the beat with PC Amanda Barnett

It's getting that time again when we start to see the warmer weather creeping in and the light nights are already here. Throughout the summer months, historically, calls for service to the police increase from people who have been victims of theft and burglary. Garden structures and ornaments are often expensive to replace, so when you're planning where to put your precious pots, think about where you are going to locate them. It doesn't take much for somebody to remove it from your garden.

Shed burglaries are also easy targets, if they're easily accessible. That expensive lawn mower or power tool can be easily sold on if you don't take precautions to protect them. Keep sheds locked and if there's a window make sure nobody can see what's inside. Put a curtain up or a board so items aren't on show. I realise that when you spend a lot of money on equipment the last thing you want to do is deface them. But, if you mark items with a brightly coloured paint they are less attractive to the buyer, so daub some bright yellow paint on them so they can be easily recognised because lets face it, how could you prove it was yours if it was found?

If you're lucky enough to have a computer and the internet, check out www.immobilise.com - this is a national property register which is available for everyone to use and log all their valuables. It's a secure site, you just have to make yourself an account which is FREE! You can upload photos, log serial numbers and even

scan receipts. It really comes in handy if you lose something and you need the information for insurance purposes and if the police recover stolen or lost/found property, it can be traced back to you.

Most items of property are easy to sell at car boots, don't let yours be on offer!

Did you know?

In September 1940, the War Office repository in Arnside Street, London where most of the British Army WW1 service records were kept, received a direct hit in an air raid and 60% of the records were destroyed. The records which were rescued from the flames or water damaged are known as the 'Burnt Records'. An estimated 2.8 million service records survived the bombing or were reconstructed from the records of the Ministry of Pensions. This means that there is a roughly 40% chance of finding the service record of a soldier who was discharged at some time between 1914 and 1920.

Obituary for Alan Smith

It is with great sadness that I find my last duty as Mayor attending the funeral and writing an obituary for Alan Smith RIP.

Alan was a long serving Winterton Town Councillor and Mayor and is fondly remembered by so many in the Town. Alan was an unusual mentor but he was just that to me, and this is not an easy obituary to write.

Alan served the town in many ways, and one of the things everyone will tell you is that he was a quirky but straightforward man in many ways, and hugely complex in others. He had a big heart, and he loved his chosen home of Winterton. A familiar sight for many years with his taxi, and with a background in the Army, Alan is responsible for instigating many initiatives ahead of their time, including leading on and campaigning for Winterton to have CCTV at a time when many town and parish councils said it was simply too expensive for them. Alan listened to residents, with quiet calm compassion and understood the need to ensure that residents felt safer, and worked alongside the then Town Clerk, Pam Dudson, to implement and oversee it. Along with Linda Cawsey he led a small group who monitored and checked it, way ahead of many other places.

Alan was always the first to stand up for employees, perhaps indicative of his long service in the Forces. He was a stalwart supporter of our staff's efforts to improve the quality of life for people in the town, but not at their own risk, and undertook the first Health and Safety checks for the Park Keeper, Peter Parker, to ensure that Peter and others were properly protected when making the Town safer.

In more recent years, Alan was unable to be as active as he would like as his health was not kind to him. It is for the courage and bravery he showed in dealing with his health that I will personally remember him most. Alan was the first person I knew to declare his fight with mental illness to a meeting full of councillors, and to be open with them about the challenges that it caused him. But this challenge too demonstrated two things to me. Firstly it demonstrated that he cared passionately and had great compassion for others, and secondly that it isn't important what people say, what matters is that despite negativity you carry on, according to your principles. In recent years, although we didn't always see eye to eye on the Council, I would often email Alan and call him if a sticky issue arose and I would rely on him to give me a straight John Bull answer to any question that I posed. And then we'd have a drink and a chat, and put the world to rights, latterly sitting in his beautiful garden.

Alan – I will miss you, and so will Winterton. We will miss you on your buggy, putting your walking stick into the ready made hole in the table at the Old School Hall, and we will miss your straight talking no nonsense. But however much we miss you, and owe you a debt of gratitude for your service I know that Marjorie and your family will miss you even more. As a couple you have been so happy even in recent months, when your health has challenged both of you, and as Marjorie said to me you had huge fortitude, immense fight and a very big heart. **Rest in peace Alan.**

Mayor's Report to Winterton Annual Town Meeting – April 29th 2014

This year, my third and last as Mayor, has been another eventful and packed year, and I hope that most of the community will continue to say that Winterton Town Council has been responsive and supportive.

I feel that this third term has allowed us to 'bed in' many of the improvements that we had started over the first two years of this Council term. Angela our Town Clerk, has now been in post for 18 months, and has now seen a full Council year. Alongside her, Peter Parker and Steve Fanthorpe continue to keep Winterton looking tidy and floral, and to respond to problems when inevitably they occur. We have instigated a number of initiatives to try and ensure that the Town is somewhere residents can be proud of.

As Mayor I have been in the last three years to over 120 events, worked with my chosen charity of Lymphoma and Leukaemia Research, been the Disabled Club and the Senior Forum and many others, represented the town outside of Winterton, and hopefully generated interest from outside in what we are doing here.

Over the last year we have faced planning matters and the Wind Farm rejection was a great example of passionate people all agreeing with each other in their opposition, but also elected representatives working together. This has gone to appeal and now we will await the next stages of the process to find out whether or not we will have Turbines

The Town Council had a number of firsts in the area. First council to register buildings as community assets (4 registered now), first Neighbourhood Planning Group in North Lincolnshire and the region's first Parish Poll when you overwhelmingly voted to keep

De Lacy House. We also want to provide more Winterton based services in agreement with North Lincolnshire Council as we believe we have the best local knowledge to get value for money. This work is ongoing.

Winterton has a caring community shown through those who give their time for others. Recently volunteers helped to provide needed support for our local young people in difficult times. It was much appreciated and we continue to fight for the best provision for our young people and elderly alike.

Tom Keir Hardie - A Winterton boy

Following the very sad death and funeral service for Tony Bilton, my lifelong friends, John and Nora Staples, forwarded to me the Order of Service, together with a copy of "Out and about in Winterton" with the article about Neville Tong. I was a team mate of Neville's at Barton Wheelers and remember him well. What a great cycling career he had, and Winterton is, and should be, well proud of his achievements.

As a boy and young man I was brought up by Jimmy and Annie Saunders at 34 Cemetery Road, attended the Church of England Primary School, the new Secondary School and was a member of the Youth Club in the old Liberal Hall. I participated in many Sports - Table Tennis, Football, Tennis and of course from 15+ Cycling. I played Football for the Under 18's with Alkborough United and then for 2 years with Winterton Rangers 1948/50. During that time I enjoyed grass track cycling with Barton Wheelers.

Having left School at the age of 14 years I went to work at Crowston's Farm on Appleby Road until I left Winterton in 1952. (In 1944 they said I was "Digging for Victory"). At the age of 19 I became a Voluntary Leader at Winterton Youth Club and went on to become the Boys' Club Leader in 1950.

The Girls' Club Leader at that time was Audrey Turner. We opened six evenings every week throughout the year. I left Winterton in 1952 to join the Army, and served my time as a Bombardier Gunnery Instructor in mid-Wales.

In 1954 my love for young people and youth work was still very

strong and I applied for a place and was accepted at St. Pierre College, for the training of Professional Youth Leaders. In 1956 I took up a Post as Leader of the North Merchiston Clubs in Edinburgh, a centre which catered for over 800 young people.

In 1957 I married Margaret, a Liverpool girl, who was very committed to the development of young people. We have a son and daughter and two grand-daughters. Margaret and I celebrate 57 years of marriage this July.

1963 saw another big change in the life of this boy from Winterton when I took up the Position of Senior Tutor and Lecturer at Liverpool University in Youth and Community work. After 10 years, and hundreds of students, another move was imminent. From 1973 to 1990 my Position was as Principle Youth Officer for the Island of Jersey, where I developed a very modern Youth Service - new buildings, leadership and training and offering the widest range of activities to thousands of young people being guided through their teenage years towards adulthood. I retired in 1990.

So I feel that Winterton has much to be proud of, Neville Tong, a World Cyclist, and myself, from an adopted son at 2 years of age, and farm boy, to a lifetime's contribution to the lives of thousands of young people, and I am sure there are many other success stories to be told. Finally, Winterton a sleepy village of 2,000, now a town, with if I might say so, an excellent community magazine. I send my best wishes to anyone who remembers me. > **Can you help? - see page 20.**

North Lincolnshire Credit Union & Winterton 2022

The Winterton 2022 Steering Group is now starting to spend the £1m Big Local Lottery grant to implement the plan it developed after consultation with our community. One of the key aims is to make Winterton a more prosperous community. One way to achieve this is to promote the greater use of Credit Unions amongst local families and individuals so that there is less business for those 'payday' and other lenders who make great profit from lending to those least able to pay high interest rates. Such lending practices leave Winterton a poorer community.

So firstly, Winterton 2022 wants to spread the word about our local credit union and encourage residents to use it. The North Lincolnshire Credit Union [NLCU] is at 162 High Street, Scunthorpe, DN15 6EH [Tel: 01724 868888; Email: north.lincs.cu@btconnect.com]. Further information can be seen on the North Lincolnshire Council website at <http://www.northlincs.gov.uk/community-advice-and-support/citizens-advice/credit-union/> but the NLCU is an independent body, entirely separate from the Council.

- All Winterton residents are eligible to be members of NLCU, which is a saving and lending co-operative.
- It is democratically owned by its members.
- It offers ethical and convenient ways to save and affordable loan facilities but only to its members.
- It is an easy and convenient way to save and borrow.
- It offers free loan protection and life savings insurance.
- There are no hidden charges or fees.
- It can offer help and support on managing personal financial affairs (if required).
- It is a member of the Financial Service Compensation Scheme so all savings are protected.
- It can help the local economy by keeping more local money in the community.

Secondly, the Winterton 2022 Steering Group has started the process of checking if there are ways of helping NLCU to offer an increased service to Winterton residents. After due checks have been made, it is likely that later this year Winterton 2022 will invest £25,000 in NLCU but ring-fence it so that it is only available for loan to Winterton residents. This will help to make sure that Winterton residents who need affordable loans are able to get them.

Three members of the Winterton 2022 Steering Group recently visited The North Lincolnshire Credit Union for discussions and were shown around. Landfill update from the Environment Agency

We inspect the two local landfills, that's the one at Winterton operated by FCC and the one at Roxby operated by Biffa.

At Winterton, the quantity of domestic waste going into the site has decreased significantly during the first half of 2014. It's this type of waste that has the biggest potential to cause odour nuisance in the area. FCC is due to update local councillors on its plans for the site shortly. This site did cause odour problems at the end of 2012 and following an investigation by the Environment Agency, the operator of the site accepted a Formal Caution for events in this period.

The Roxby landfill site generated a large number of odour complaints during the second half of 2013. Biffa has made improvements on the site and the quantity of odorous waste in the trains arriving from Manchester has also decreased. The Manchester waste is starting to be processed in a new treatment plant in the North West and when this plant is fully operational it is expected that deliveries of waste to Roxby from Manchester will cease. Last year typically there were three trains a day arriving from Manchester, in recent weeks this has decreased to one a day. Waste continues to also arrive by road including North Lincolnshire domestic waste.

Since just before Christmas we have seen a reduction in the odour we detect when we inspect in the area. This has been supported by the reduction in number of odour reports we receive and comments from residents we meet when we are in Winterton and Roxby.


If you are affected by odours from either site, you can report these on our 24 hour a day, 7 day a week incident hotline, **0800 80 70 60**.

Now that the weather is warming up we have also been making sure that both sites are ensuring that fly infestations can't start on either site. During our recent inspections we have seen no evidence of significant fly activity.

Both landfills hold regular liaison meetings attended by us, the site operator and parish, town and North Lincolnshire councillors.

For information, the graph below shows the odour reports we've received from you since January 2013 in the Winterton Town and Roxby village area. Based on the reported details, weather conditions and information from the landfill sites themselves, we have tried to identify the most likely source of the reported odour.

Please note that unless an authorised Environment Agency officer has been able to investigate the specific incident whilst odour was still present, this is only an indication of the most likely source.



New Biffa site manager

Biffa Landfill Site at Roxby has undergone changes in management with Craig Turnbull taking over the role of Site Manager from Fraser James, who has recently left the company. 

Tyres and plasterboard will only be accepted at Winterton HRC during this period, not at the other two sites. Also, asbestos will be accepted at Winterton for this period between the hours of 10am to 4pm.


