A referendum to save De Lacy House?

As Out 'n About goes to press a Town Meeting has been fixed for 12th November so the PEOPLE OF WINTERTON can make a decision about a referendum (Parish Poll) regarding the future of De Lacy House.

This referendum is called because North Lincolnshire Council refuses to recognise the 2483 folk who signed a petition earlier in the year. Instead they intend to demolish De Lacy House, stating that Winterton wants a new Intermediate Care Facility.

This Intermediate Care Facility they propose is for the whole of North Lincolnshire. **No-one I have spoken to in Winterton opposes this Facility, but people are puzzled as to why it must be built on the De Lacy site when there are over 20 other NLC-owned sites available in North Lincs,** many of them nearer the Hospital and without any buildings on them. There is such a site in Winterton which had been brought to the attention of NLC as reported in the last issue of Out 'n About. **None** of these sites have been considered. NLC may not have the last word on where it should be built anyway!

One of the NLC Main Policy Statements is that they will consult residents on important issues and utilise Local Legislation to support our communities to define what they want for their area and to encourage more accountable democracy. How can they honestly say that they are doing this?

People have said to us that they want to keep De Lacy House to be a residential, respite and daycare unit used by Winterton area people.

With care services for older people being scaled back and in some cases axed, it is vital that De Lacy House becomes a base for community work amongst the elderly and vulnerable. It has huge potential as a clinical base as identified in recent Public Health reports. The Care Quality



Commission Inspection report for 28th February 2013 showed that De Lacy House fully met all the standards and was clearly fit for purpose. Why knock it down? If it is true that asbestos has been discovered, there is a case for NOT demolishing since dealing with it in situ may be a far less costly option.

The new Winterton Care Campaign Group along with The Poirier Foundation (both non-political) are developing a vision for the future of De Lacy House. If the demolition can be stopped we can begin to look at a future for this listed Community Asset. Grants are available and we can make this work for Winterton.

We need you to vote to save De Lacy House if a Parish Poll is held.

Landfill Update from the Environment Agency

We inspect the two local landfills, that's the one at Winterton operated by FCC and the one at Roxby operated by Biffa. Both landfills have generated unacceptable levels of odour away from the sites during periods in the last 12 months.


In autumn 2012, it was the FCC site that was causing an issue. Following our site inspections and many complaints from members of the public, FCC installed additional gas pipework to improve the collection efficiency of the gas produced by the decomposition of the landfilled waste.

More recently off-site odours have been associated with the Biffa site. Part of this was due to problems stemming from the heavy rainfall last winter that flooded the area of site where waste was due to be tipped. However as odours have continued through the summer, we have turned our attention to the wastes being delivered to the site. These wastes come from a number of sources including domestic waste from Manchester that arrives by train and domestic waste from North Lincolnshire arriving by refuse lorry. We have been monitoring and observing the various wastes as they are tipped at Roxby. Following this work, our officers have inspected the sites that process the domestic waste in Manchester prior to it being loaded on the trains. This work led to the temporary suspension in October and November of one of the three trains that deliver to Roxby each day. We are monitoring the effect of removing this train load of waste.

Both landfills hold regular liaison meetings attended by us, the site operator and parish, town and North Lincolnshire councillors. Andrew Percy MP has also visited the Roxby site and attended one of the recent liaison meetings.

We realise this has been a difficult period for local residents and we appreciate the odour reports that you provide to us. We can't be at the landfills every day so your reports are vital to us. Please continue to report when you are affected by odours on our 24 hour a day, 7 day a week incident hotline, **0800 80 70 60**.

For information, the graph below shows the odour reports we've received from you over the last 12 months in the Winterton Town and Roxby village area. Based on the reported details, weather conditions and information from the landfill sites themselves, we have tried to identify the most likely source of the reported odour.



Please note that unless an authorised Environment Agency officer has been able to investigate the specific incident whilst odour was still present, this is only an indication of the most likely source.

Horkstow Bridge closed until further notice

The Environment Agency has closed Horkstow Bridge until further notice. The Grade II* listed bridge sustained fire damage to the suspension chains, which has reduced the load carrying capacity.

Until further investigations are completed, the Environment Agency do not know the full extent of the damage, or the duration of closure required.

The diversion route is C114 (Ermine Street), A1077 to South Ferriby, B1204, Bridge Lane (Horkstow).

Out 'n About in Winterton contacted the Environment Agency for an update and their response was: *"We closed Horkstow Bridge over the River Ancholme as a result of a car fire which*

damaged one of its main structural supports. The bridge is Grade 2 listed and has a limited weight capacity. We need to be sure that it is safe before we can re-open the bridge to vehicles. The navigation under the bridge remains unaffected and pedestrians and cyclists can still cross.*

Once a specialist investigation has been completed we will have a clearer idea of any damage and what needs to be done."

On the beat with PC Amanda Barnett

Every 12 weeks a meeting is held locally to discuss any policing issues which are occurring in the Winterton & Burton ward area. It is called the Neighbourhood Action Team (NAT). Representatives from neighbourhood watch groups, parish councils, the police, North Lincs Council Safer Neighbourhoods and other partnership agencies attend. The meeting is chaired by Cllr Ralph Ogg. Issues can be raised by anybody in the community which are then discussed at the meeting so it can be addressed through partnership working.

This month concerns have been raised regarding anti social behaviour occurring on the High Street, Winterton. Police have received several calls for service following incidents outside West Street Park. CCTV has been installed to monitor this area and it has been highlighted as a 'NAT Priority' which means the police will attend all calls for service to that area and extra patrols will be carried out in the vicinity. It is very intimidating for people who want to use the footpath when there are several young people gathered there. If you have youngsters who meet with their friends at West Street park please remind them of their consideration to others and not to gather on the street but to use the park responsibly.

The youth service will also be doing some outreach work in the area. Please encourage your children

to engage with the workers, if seen, so they can put their views forward and consideration can be taken when decisions are made regarding youth provision in Winterton.



Leek Hill road closure

Out 'n About in Winterton contacted North Lincolnshire Councillor, Ralph Ogg, Lead Member for Highways, and Anglian Water regarding the recent road closure in Leek Hill.

Councillor Ogg's response was *"The problems on Leek Hill are caused by a blockage that was discovered following investigations on Earls Gate on Wednesday 23 October.*

Fractures to the Sewerage and Water systems were found and Anglian Water took the decision to close the road, so that emergency works could be carried out rather than the properties on Leek Hill enduring problems that could be exacerbated by the forthcoming inclement weather.

The water problem was fixed on Friday [25 October] and according to Anglian Water the sewerage problem will be sorted today [28 October].

North Lincolnshire Council send apologies for all inconvenience to residents but Anglian Water have all rights and powers to close the road so that these emergency works can be carried out in the quickest time possible."

Anglian Water, Small Works Engineer, Paul Laughton said, *"The local council instigated this road closure to investigate some problems with the drains on Leek Hill. When they excavated down on one of the manholes, they found that the water main had caused some damage to the drain when the mains were renewed in that area some 10-12 years ago.*

The local council contacted us on 24 October 2013 regarding this. In my absence, Andrew Rock contacted a local contractor (A.J Button) to lift the water main and repair the damaged drain. In doing this, the council advised Balfour Beatty (our Contractors) to take over the road closure, which



they did. All signs and barriers were exchanged on the morning of Friday 25 October 2013 and A.J Button completed the repair the same day. The reinstatement was completed by BBUSL on Saturday 26 October 2013 and their road closure was lifted on that day. However, the local council still had work to do on Leek Hill so reinstalled the road closure.

Unfortunately, we were unaware that the works were still on going. However, when I arrived on site at 9am on 1 November 2013, I found the council finishing of the reinstatements around road gully's and manholes on Leek Hill."

■ While the Editor was taking pictures of the road closure, a member of the public mentioned that the road closure signs from the 29th August resurfacing works are still attached to lamp posts in Sowers Lane, and as can be seen in the picture above, Leek Hill. This information was forwarded to Cllr Ogg and his response was *"With regard to the signs on Sowers Hill, we have taken issue with the contractors and asked that they remove the signs, as they are their responsibility. We will chase again and ask for urgent removal."*

At the time of going to press, the signs were still in situ.

Please if you bring children to and from school whether to playschool, Panda Play, Infants, Juniors or Academy, remember there are two lollipop ladies - one on Northlands Road and the other on West Street, outside the Infants. They are there to make



sure that you and your children arrive at school safe. We are allowed to cross **all pedestrians**, old or young.

Please remember to cross in front of them, not behind as we cannot see you. Also please do not cross between cars or some distance away as we do not want any accidents, and please do not follow the lollipop lady if she is returning to the kerb as she does not know you are there.

What is the speed limit around Winterton and on West Street? There are signs to tell you. **Please for the sake of all pedestrians** keep to them as we have both been nearly knocked down because of speed, and you never know when a child is going to run out into the road.

The only vehicles that are allowed to speed are the emergency services on an emergency callout.

Winterton Community Pavilion

Officially Opened 21st October, 2013

The Official Opening of the Winterton Community Pavilion took place on a very wet and dismal Monday afternoon during the school October half term. There was a huge response by the young players from Dale Park Junior Football Club who showed off their skills in front of former England Manager Graham Taylor, OBE, and a camera crew from ITVs Calendar programme.



Graham spent all afternoon chatting to the youngsters, and their managers, before spending time with members of the Town Council and the Winterton PFA, who respectively own and run the Newport Drive Facility. Representatives of all the funding organisations were present to see at first hand the fantastic building which their generosity had made possible. Winterton now has an affordable, fully licensed, state of the art facility available to hire by individuals and organisations in the town. Because the building is heated by geothermal energy it will attract the government Renewable Heating Incentive which help towards the running costs of the building.

At the present time the cost of hiring of the 50 feet square community room are £10 per hour and £15 per hour at weekends. Registered charities receive a reduction on these fees and a premium is added for business users. There is also a small charge for groups wishing to take advantage of the licenses held by the PFA. The hire fees include the use of the fully fitted commercial kitchen and all ancillary costs such as lighting and heating. The room is capable of holding 150 people for a sit down meal and 250 people for other activities.

but we are under strict orders not to reveal "who did it"!

We will have a stall at the Winterton Senior Citizens Forum Christmas Fayre on Saturday 14th December. Come and join us. We understand that there will be fantastic cakes!

Thank you to all who attended our Make a Difference Day. The funds raised will go towards our Christmas celebrations, starting with a Christmas Party at the Ingleby Arms, Amcotts on 3rd December and a Nostalgia Show with Terry Richards on 17th December.

Our members continue to be baffled by Cllr Waltham's relentless pursuit in denying them the care services they need in their own community. **How many times do they need to say that they have no objection to the New Intermediate Care proposal** although this doesn't meet their care needs? In a nutshell:

- they want to remain near family and friends when they are in need of residential care, respite care as well as day care.
- they don't want to be treated like parcels carted around North Lincs.
- they want to be treated with dignity.

By all means let's have this new Intermediate Care facility but not at the expense of De Lacy House which can continue to serve the community for many years to come. There are 22 other sites where the new ICF could be built but they have not even been taken into consideration. One such site available in Winterton was brought to the attention of Cllr Waltham but he dismissed this saying : "In terms of a location for a future building, the council has an obligation to obtain the **best possible value** for the council tax payer".

So is it best possible value to spend our money on the

substantial cost of demolishing a relatively recent modern building (built in 1981)? If another plot without any building on it is used then this expenditure can be saved and that would be **best possible value**.

Now, asbestos has been found at De Lacy House. It is our understanding that asbestos becomes a problem if it is disturbed and the demolition would certainly do that. DLH could be used without major refurbishment. The Poirier Suite was perfectly fine to accommodate respite care and there is no need to convert/ alter other rooms for the delivery of day care. If regular monitoring is carried out asbestos should not present a problem as long as it is not disturbed and it doesn't need to be. There are thousands, may be millions of buildings in the UK containing asbestos, including schools, but there are no thoughts of demolishing them.

The whole De Lacy House episode has brought the best out of people but has also unfortunately brought the worst out of others.

Our members do not play political games but are still labelled "lefties militants with political ambitions" and are vilified just because they feel that the Winterton community must not be denied the opportunity of developing better care for its residents. Members feel ignored and abandoned by people who have been elected to serve the people of North Lincolnshire. Let us convey the feelings of one of our members (well into her 80's) who is much distressed about the whole situation. She says: "I am so angry at the way we are being treated. I was born in Winterton, I have lived in Winterton all my life, I have brought my family up in Winterton, I have paid my taxes all these years and now I am approaching the time when I will need to go into a care home they will not let me die in Winterton".

We have been accused of turning the campaign into a personal attack on Cllr Waltham. So who else can we name when he is the one who has taken the decision to demolish De Lacy to build this ICF on the site? He is also the one who has taken the accessible minibus away from us. He is the one who made unsubstantiated allegations on Radio Humberside and insulted members of the public at the Scrutiny Panel. He is the one who promised to work with us but he promptly refused any part of our proposals. **HE IS THE ONE WHO IS NOT LISTENING.**

Finally we had the privilege of sharing a birthday party for our member, Beryl Greenway who celebrated her 100th birthday on the 6th November. Thank you to Cllr Francesca Marritt, Mayor of Winterton, who came to celebrate with us.

Another famous son of Winterton

In the summer issue of Out 'n About in Winterton, Terry Johnson focused on the world famous astronomer, Wallace Sargent, who in his early days lived in a council house in Earlsgate Gardens (now part of Cliff Avenue). This time we look at national and international cyclist Nev Tong.

The greatest sports person to come from Winterton is Neville (Nev) Tong, national and international cyclist on both grass and cement tracks. Nev was brought up down Holmes Lane so had to cycle the three miles to school every day. This gave him the taste for competitive cycle racing. When Nev was 14, he needed a decent bike to take up racing seriously. Money was tight so Nev went potato picking, pea pulling, bean pulling, anything to raise money to buy enough special parts to build his own racing bike. This he accomplished and joined Barton Wheelers at the age of 15.

Nev started competing in time trials and was successful in his first season. The following year, 1950, he also started grass track racing with immediate success, he won races five weekends straight away at different venues. Nev became so successful he gave up his job as a steel erector during the summer to concentrate on his racing. Nev had to suspend his racing while he did his National Service.

As soon as he finished serving Queen and country it was back to the same routine, summer racing and steel erecting during winter. During his career Nev won many trophies outright, winning the same event three years running or four times altogether. He won the Winterton Mid-Summer cup four times. His first national championship win came in 1957 when he won the 880-yard grass track championship held at Harworth.

Nev competed all over the country. He won a five mile race in Scotland, the Dundee Grand Prix and recorded the fastest time ever in Scotland. In 1956 he was awarded the Festival of Britain Trophy for being the area's sportsman of the year.

1958 was to be a year Nev would never forget. After many races and several run-offs Nev was picked to represent England at the Empire and Commonwealth Games held in Cardiff. On Wednesday 24th July Nev competed in the 1000-metre time trial and set a time of 1

min 12.1 seconds. This not only won him the gold medal but also broke the Commonwealth record. The following days

papers headlined Nev's success and a proud local Winterton lad could not believe what he had achieved.

6th August 1958 - Nev was training with the Great Britain squad at Fallowfield, Manchester under the supervision of five times world sprint champion Reg. Harris, when a terrible accident occurred. Two riders caused a pile-up bringing down several riders including Nev. He was

seriously hurt and rushed to Macclesfield Infirmary. Doctors gave Nev only 24 hours to live. He was unconscious for eight days. When he did recover he was told his racing days and steel erecting days were over. Doctors didn't know the strength of character or the determination of Nev Tong. Five weeks after his spill, Nev was back on his bike and soon doing 100 miles a week and back in training.

March 1959 - Nev was selected to take part in the Southern Games in Trinidad and was again successful. Later the same season Nev was a member of the England

team that visited East Germany, and at Leipzig in front of 100,000 spectators Nev broke the East German record for the 1,000 metre time trial. 1960 was Nev's final year as a successful cyclist, culminating with him winning the National 5 mile grass track championship at Littleport.

Nev Tong set up his own very successful roofing and construction business. Nev has now retired and lives happily with his wife Joan in Scotter. They have two children and three grandchildren.

These two sons of Winterton although both coming from humble beginnings, through hard work, determination and passion they both achieved national and international fame, one as an academic the other as a sportsman. We should hold these men up as examples to the young people of Winterton to show through hard work and following that dream what you can get out of life. I would like to see a small fund set up to buy two trophies in their honour. These would be presented annually at the local senior school, one for the best academic, the other for best sportsman.

All Saints' Winterton closure 2014

No doubt you will all be aware that All Saints Winterton is to be closed for at least one year as major works are being carried out there.

I am writing to advise you all that as a worshipping community we are still very much in business, it's just that things will happen elsewhere. As your vicar I believe most strongly that we should maintain stability and ensure everyone knows what will happen where. So I've been trying to keep things straightforward.

As at present all Sunday morning services will take place, but in the Old School Hall, West Street following the same pattern, ie 1st Sunday of the month at 8.00am and 2nd, 3rd, & 4th Sundays at 10.45am. It will still be worth checking the Parish magazine or our website to check. This venue is good because it is near to All Saints, and we can walk or drive past it en route to church.

The Tuesday Eucharist held weekly at 9.15am will transfer to the "Upper Room" which is upstairs from Mike Joyces' business premises in the King Street. We will access the room from the small yard behind.

We are extremely grateful to the OSH committee and Mike Joyce for offering us hospitality while we are "homeless".

The Roman Catholic Saturday Mass (5.30pm) will transfer to St Mary, Roxby, and we are very grateful to the Churchwardens & PCC for enabling this to take place.

With regard to Weddings, we will NOT be able to carry these out in Winterton, but we can use any of the 3 other Group churches, namely, Appleby, Roxby or Winteringham. And the same applies to Baptisms, though I will be happy to consider doing Winterton baptisms during the Sunday service at 10.45 in the OSH, this is perfectly permissible, unlike weddings where I am legally constrained.

Funerals too, can be held at any of the 3 other group churches, or if a family really want a service in Winterton we can hopefully arrange to carry one out at Winterton Methodist Chapel, using the Anglican order should that be required. Of course we can still carry out funerals at the Crematorium.

We are still at All Saints for Christmas and will hold our usual Christingle at 4pm on 15 Dec, our Midnight Mass at 10.30pm on Christmas Eve and Parish Eucharist at 10.30am on Christmas Day. Carols will be sung at the George Hogg on Tuesday 17th December (exact time tbc, but followed by a fun seasonal quiz). The final Sunday service will be on 29th December at 10.45am, so do be there for that, to say goodbye to All Saints for a while.


When we will be back at All Saints is difficult to predict, but we hope the closure will not be for much more than a year.

Winterton

All Saints' Church to close for repairs and refurbishment in 2014

All Saints' Church will close on 1st January 2014 and will remain closed for the rest of the year. This will allow the huge amount of building work to be completed as quickly as possible. Arrangements for weekly church services and wedding, baptisms and funerals are noted elsewhere in this edition.

Plans are being made to empty the church in the first half of January 2014. Professional storage will be needed for all the moveable contents which are to be retained. They cannot stay in the church as the floor in the nave/aisles/transepts will be lifted so that the archaeologist can check the surface layers beneath the paving and pew platforms. At the time of writing the PCC still has to decide which items, including pew benches, to retain and which will be sold off and at what price. All this will be clarified in the next few weeks.

The latest design drawings are currently on display in the church and on the church website at <http://lincoln.ourchurchweb.org.uk/winterton/> The final consents and permissions are now being sought from the diocese and planning authorities. The main contractor will be appointed in the next few weeks and is expected to move on site by early February. The work will include roof, masonry and window repairs; a new level floor with underfloor heating; new lighting, sound and security systems; a small extension outside the North Porch for three new toilets and a small kitchen with full catering equipment; new high quality chairs/benches and tables with storage cupboards; and creation of new heritage displays and storage for the many archives and artefacts. A key feature in this will be the Tower which was built around 1080 and shows many original features which tell the story about why it was built. A recent addition to the plan, if extra grant funding can be obtained, is to include modern stained glass in the small west window above the Tower door. During the works there will be days when the site can be viewed by those interested in, for example, the archaeological dig and the construction of the new extension with dry stone walling similar to that in the Tower.

A great deal of conservation work is also involved covering the paper archives, pipe organ, oil painting and old reredos screen, 1593 altar, internal wall monuments, medieval stone fragments, medieval churchyard cross stump, Victorian bier and velvet pall [which will return

to the church for display after a long absence], medieval door ironwork; South Transept gable window and tower clock face. It is planned that conservation work to the Town War Memorial will be included.

The full cost of this major project is estimated at just over £1m. A grant of over £748,000 has been obtained from the Heritage Lottery Fund with the remainder provided by eighteen other funders. Full details of these grants are listed on the church website.

Once the church reopens in 2015 [or earlier if we are lucky!], there will be a programme of activities to make use of the new facilities. The space offered in the refurbished building will be available for a much wider

range of community uses. This entire project follows extensive community consultations which started in 2009.






